8. To help build more compelling arguments by presenting evidence and supporting details in a coherent and impactful manner.
9. To add variety to your writing, preventing it from becoming monotonous and repetitive
10. To help eliminate sentence fragments, ensuring that your writing adheres to grammatical rules and maintains readability.
