What is an International Organization?

An **International Organization** is a group made up of many countries that work together for common goals.

These organizations help countries solve problems, keep peace, and support development around the world.

🎯 Why Do We Need International Organizations?

Because no country can solve all problems alone.

International organizations help:

- ✓ Keep peace between countries
- ✓ Fight poverty and diseases
- ✓ Protect human rights
- ✓ Support education and health
- ✓ Solve conflicts without war

📋 Types of International Organizations

There are two main types:

1 📋 Global Organizations

- Include many countries from all around the world.
- Example: **United Nations (UN)**

2 📋 Regional Organizations

- Include countries from the same region.
- Example: **African Union (AU), European Union (EU)**

💰 World Health Organization (WHO)	Improve global health	Geneva, Switzerland
💵 International Monetary Fund (IMF)	Support global economy and finance	Washington, USA
⚖️ International Court of Justice (ICJ)	Settle disputes between countries legally	The Hague, Netherlands
African Union (AU)	Promote unity and peace in Africa	Addis Ababa, Ethiopia
