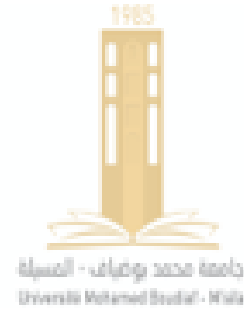


Corruption in Education

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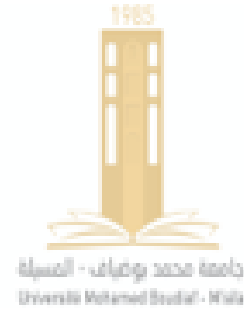


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Introduction

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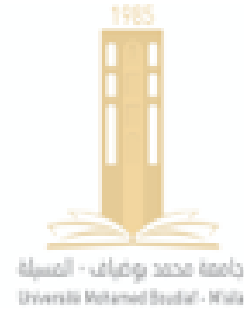
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Scenarios illustrating Corruption in Education

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Here are some scenarios illustrating corruption in education:

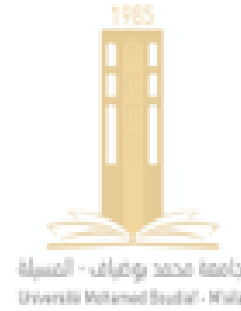
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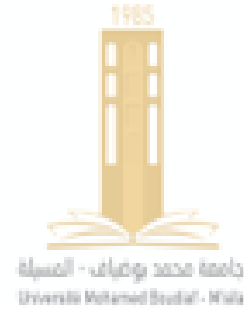
Bribery in Admissions

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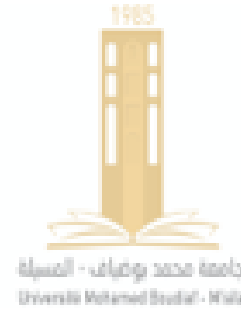

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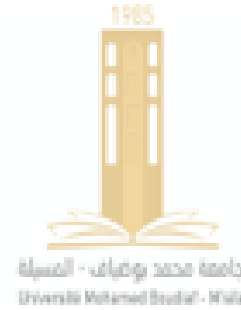
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Embezzlement



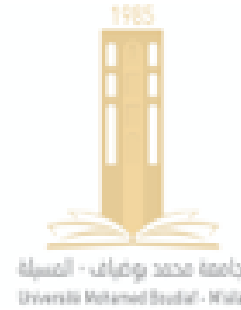

Nepotism



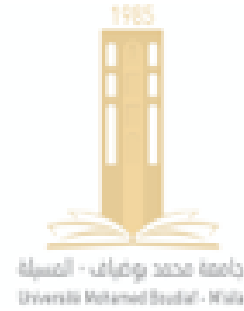

Plagiarism : learners copy lessons or academic materials from online sources without attribution, presenting them as original work, thus failing to uphold academic integrity and honesty.

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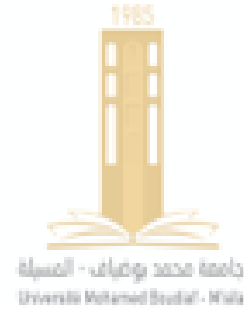


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Cheating

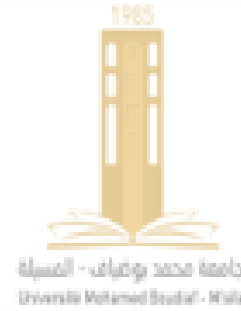
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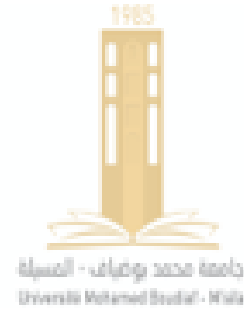
Falsification

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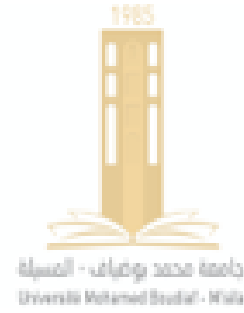
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Kickbacks

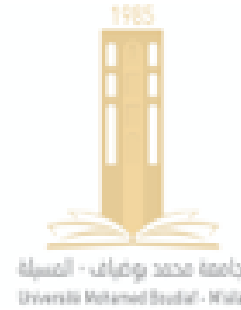
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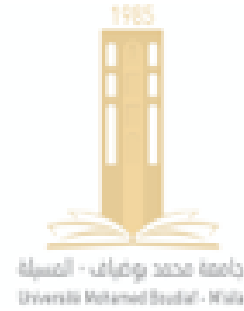
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Ghost Schools

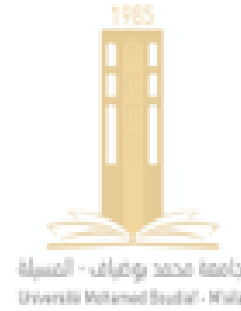
